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CCA Stand-down for Sec 1 to 3

7 To allow students time to prepare for the End of Year Examinations, all students will stand down from CCAs from 15 September Monday onwards. CCA Training for Sec 1 to 3 students will resume after the End of Year Examinations.

8 Please also note that CCA sessions on 22 and 23 October will take place from 7.30am to 12.30pm; and there will be no afternoon training sessions in that week.

Early Dismissal Due to GCE N Level Listening Comprehension – 16 September Tuesday and 17 September Wednesday

9 The GCE N level MTL and English Listening Comprehension examination will take place on 16 and 17 September. All Sec 1 to 3 and 4E/5NA students will be dismissed at 1.00pm and are to leave the school promptly.

Special Day-Off – 25 September Thursday

10 25 September Thursday has been designated as a Special Day Off for all staff and students, in appreciation of their contributions to the school's celebratory activities for Deyi's 45th Anniversary and SG60 this year.

11 Lessons will resume on 26 September Friday via blended learning for all Secondary 1 to 3 students, with students returning to school on 29 September Monday.

Blended Learning Day – 26 September Friday

12 Please note that Term 4 Week 2, 26 September Friday will follow the Even Week's Friday Timetable. Students will not be required to be physically present in school for lessons as students will be learning from home, or completing their Student Initiated Learning (SIL) project if they have not already done so, for submission to their form teachers. End-of-Year Examination

14 The End-of-Year Examination begins in Term 4 Week 3 for Secondary 1 to 3 students. The examination timetable has been given to students, and it is also available on the school website.

15 Students should refer to the rules and regulations for the examination in the Student Handbook. Students must inform their Form Teachers if they are absent from the exam and submit a Medical Certificate when they return to school. Students may leave the school after completing their exam for the day.

16 Students are **not required to attend school on 10 October Friday** which is the school's Marking Day, as well as **17 October Friday** which is the Results Processing Day.

17 Please be informed that dismissal time for this week will be 1.30pm for 13 October Monday to 15 October Wednesday. As there is GCE O-level exam starting at 1.30pm on 16 October Thursday, the dismissal time will be 12.30pm. 18 As part of Learning Festival 2025, we will be hosting an Education and Career Guidance (ECG) Fair on 21 October Tuesday from 8.00am to 12.30pm. 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a cleaning cloth to help spruce up their classroom, while the school will provide the other necessary cleaning materials.

26 To help your child/ward revise key topics and prepare for the following year, subject teachers may identify some assignments to be done in November-December. We appreciate your support in ensuring that your child/ward completes the assignments and spaces out his/her revision over the holidays so that he/she will also have sufficient time to deliver quality work and have adequate rest and relaxation before school reopens. These assignments are to be handed in, in Week 2, Term 1, in 2026.

27 A number of activities will continue to take place until 15 November, e.g. Student Leadership training, specific CCA practices and enrichment activities. The respective teachers-in-charge of these activities will be informing you of the schedule and your child's/ward's commitment through Parents Gateway.

Applied Learning Module at School (ApLM@Schools) for students doing GCE N-Level syllabus

28 To better prepare our students for their Secondary 4 elective subjects in 2026 and as part of their portfolio-building, they will participate in a series of vendor-run programmes during the first week of the year-end school holidays.

29 The design of *ApLM@School* aims to achieve one or more of the following objectives:

- Extend and build upon the learning objectives of existing Sec 3 N-Level subjects through applied learning;
- Introduce students to possible courses of study in post-secondary education institutions (PSEIs); and
- Provide exposure to potential career pathways.
